

Potential Areas of Agreement

- Mineral withdrawal for all public lands in Teton County
 - Includes oil and gas, locatable (gold, copper etc. and other hard rock), leasable (coal) and salable.
 - Legislation would not affect common varieties, e.g. sand and gravel.
- USFS roadless rule parameters to become legislative language and would be applied to all inventoried roadless areas in Teton county not designated as wilderness in the bill.
 - Approximately 177,627 acres
 - 36 CFR Part 294 prohibits with exceptions:
 - Road construction and road reconstruction (part 294.12)
 - Commercial timber cutting, sale or removal (part 294.13)
- State land section transfers, swaps and conveyances
 - Crystal Butte section
 - Discuss with the FS other potential swaps of interest e.g. Flat Creek section
- Wildlife protections
 - Setting a limit or “carrying capacity” via limiting number of miles of trails or roads that can’t be exceeded (e.g. no net gain)
 - Seasonal closures. Clarifying management intent of these areas to prioritize wildlife (incl. non-game wildlife)

Ideas for wilderness designations outside of WSAs

- Teton County portion of Grayback Ridge IRA (approx. 26,788 acres)
- Grizzly Lake IRA (approx. 3,955 acres add to Gros Ventre Wilderness)
- West slope of the Tetons IRAs adjacent to Jed Smith Wilderness (approx. 39,189 acres)
- Spread Creek IRA (205,171 acres)—investigate current roads/motorized trails and determine what portion might be designated
- All lands inside GTNP in Teton Range (no real change from current management)
- JDR parkway lands (except for road corridor)
- Teton County portion of Yellowstone NP—investigate interest w/ NPS
